The I-75 Relief Task Force was established to provide consensus recommendations for maximizing existing and developing new high-capacity transportation corridors to serve the Tampa Bay to Northeast Florida area, with initial emphasis along and to the west of I-75 in Alachua, Citrus, Hernando, Levy, Marion, and Sumter counties.

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is hosting this Community Open House to share information on the I-75 Relief Task Force, and to provide you with an opportunity to give input on the preliminary purpose and need, environmental and community resources, and the approach to evaluating potential corridor options.

Station Information

Station 1 – Introduction to the Task Force Process

We encourage you to watch a brief overview presentation (on a continuous loop) to be introduced to the I-75 Relief background and learn about the Task Force process and its work to date.

Station 2 - Preliminary Purpose and Need

The two distinct elements of the preliminary purpose and need are (1) Providing relief to I-75 and improving mobility in the initial focus area and (2) Enhancing regional connectivity between Tampa Bay and Northeast Florida.

Station 3 – Understanding the Initial Focus Area Resources Review maps of important resources that have been identified in the initial focus area, organized through the themes of the "4 Cs" – conservation, countryside, centers and communities, and corridors.

Station 4 – Avoidance and Minimization Areas

View resources that have been identified as priorities for avoidance and/or minimization of impacts during initial planning, and identification of future options.
