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Future Corridors Planning Process: The Future Corridors planning process emphasizes the need for enhanced coordination on long-term decisions about transportation, land use, economic development, and environmental stewardship. This process also allows for public input during earlier stages of transportation planning.

Purpose and Need: The Task Force charge has identified needs for future transportation improvements in the study area.

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Framework: The Task Force developed a draft framework of options for future studies, including strategies to 1) optimize existing corridors through the use of technology and operational solutions; 2) enhance or transform existing corridors such as I-75, U.S. 301 and U.S. 41; and 3) identify areas of opportunity for future studies for potential new multimodal and multiuse corridors (presented at station 3).
